Two of the imprisoned men were rescued by divers this afternoon. They had been entombed since 5 o'clock yesterday morning. They were greatly exhausted. It was first thought that no more than two were caught.

SULTAN YIELDS

TURKISH REVOLT

Paris, Dec. 19.—The papers report that a revolt has taken place in the province of Albanian. Several officers were murdered and the rebels were victorious over 3000 Turkish troops.

AN ILLINOIS BANK

St. Louis, Dec. 19.—Four robbers this morning blew open the safe of the bank in Baldwin, Illinois, but were frightened away before they secured much booty. They were attacked by the citizens and shots were exchanged at intervals covering a half hour. No one was hurt.

PROMINENT BAPTIST PREACHER DEAD

New York, Dec. 19.—Rev. Dr. James B. Simmons, a trustee of Brown University, and formerly secretary of the Baptist Home Missions, died yesterday, aged 78 years. He held long pastorates in Providence, Indianapolis and Philadelphia, and for many years was pastor of the old Trinity Baptist church in New York. Dr. Simmons was very active for establishing schools for freedmen in the south and Simmons College, Abilene, Tex., is named after him. On the grounds of this college the body will be buried.

FOR ADULTERY

Boise, Dec. 19.—In district court today the trial of the Suttles case was concluded until 3 p. m. After the case went to the jury, Mrs. Turpin and Fred Law who had pleaded guilty were brought in and sentenced. Mrs. Turpin will serve a term of five months in the county jail, while her paramour, Fred Law will serve a term of seven months in the penitentiary.

BOOKS FOR PUBLIC SCHOOLS.

About 15,000 books will be purchased in the near future by the Oregon state library commission and distributed among the 2000 school districts of the state. The money used in the purchase of these books was secured by the various school district library tax levies and amounts to about \$15,000.
