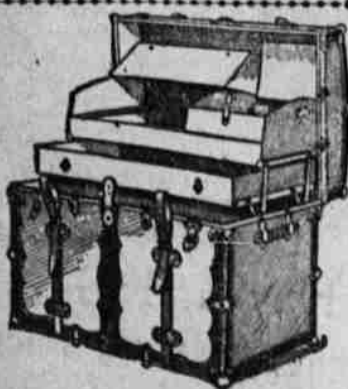

**CHAOS
REIGNS IN
RUSSIA**

(Scripps News Association)
St Petersburg, Dec. 21.—The troops, after a fierce battle, recaptured Taku from the rebels, who defended the town most scientifically, proving that they were led by trained military officers. The peasants have driven the land owners from Vilebsk and have divided the estates among themselves.

A communistic republic has been proclaimed at Tjills. Workmen are in control at Yaroslavl. They propose to operate the factories and divide the profits. The government fears the attitude of the troops at Kronstadt. The revolutionists control Batoum. The water front has been fired and a number of vessels burned.

MARTIAL LAW ENFORCED
Moscow, Dec. 21.—Martial law has been proclaimed in this city today.

STRIKE SPREADING
St. Petersburg, Dec. 21.—The strike is rapidly spreading all over Russia. The workmen are showing perfect discipline under able leaders. There is undescrivable panic among the people generally. All feel that this is the opening of the last act of the national tragedy and will result in either the downfall of the government or a victory for autocracy. The conditions have almost reached the proportions of a civil war. It is not proper to call the movement a mere industrial strike. The financial ruin of the country seems imminent. Many soldiers have been arrested while addressing the people to join the rebels. Prices of all supplies are rapidly rising. Everybody is trying to secure the greatest amount of provisions possible in anticipation of a long siege. Revolutionists have wrecked a train near Riga which resulted in the killing of five soldiers and the wounding of 20 others.

RUSSIA IN CHAOS
St. Petersburg, Dec. 21.—The continental train left Warsaw under a strong guard. A strike began at Nicholas Station at noon although the Baltic roads were still working at that hour. Twelve thousand Putiloff employees have struck. All trains entering the Baltic provinces are being stopped. From one the Cosacks were taken and disarmed.

The strike leaders at Moscow are boasting that the strike will be transformed into an armed revolution and orators are declaring that Russia will be drenched with blood before the struggle is ended. Governor General Dubasoff has moved into the late Grand Duke Sergis palace. He has declared a relentless war upon the agitators.

BOMBS AT ODESSA
Odessa, Dec. 21.—One hundred and forty bombs were discovered in the house of a Jew. One exploded, wounding eight officers. The affair caused an outbreak of anti-Semitic feeling.

EXAMINE BANKER'S LIFE

New York, Dec. 21.—Howard K. Stokes, third vice-president of the Bankers' Life, was recalled to the insurance stand this morning. Hendricks, superintendent of insurance, and Isaac Vanderpool, chief examiner, were present.

Hendricks gave a list of the employees of his office and their salaries. He employed his daughter as his confidential clerk, paying her a salary of \$2600 a year.

The committee decided not to take testimony at Albany, but will investigate here. Armstrong says it will conclude December 30.
