No. 2-Constitutional Amendment givng cities and towns exclusive power to act and amend charters, subject to the constitution and oriminal laws.


No. 3-To allow state printing, binding and printer compensation to be regulated by law at any time.

No. 4-Giving one legislative assembly power to propose and submit to the people amendments to the constitution. and making it the governor's duty to proclaim adoption of amendments, and reouiring the people's approval before a
