MILK TALK No. 1.

CHEAP MILK OR MILK CHEAP, WHICH?

Are you buying your milk chaap or are you getting cheap milk? That is the question which every consumer should consider before buying. There are five properties contained in milk, viz; ash, or bone material, caseine or curd, butterfat, sugar, and water, in proportion of .5 of 1% ash, 5.5% caseine, 4% butterfat, 5% sugar, 87% water.
