WHAT IT MEANS

To form an idea of the addition to the volume of business the addition of a thousand new comers would make, the following figures from the United States statistics will be helpful. The Department of Commerce, Finance and Labor gave out that at wholesale prices on Nov. 1st, 1905 the cost for the necessities of life per year, per capita in the United States was for breadstuffs \$18,053; for meats \$8,441, for dairy and garden products \$14,802, for other food \$9,622, for clothing \$18,839, for metals \$16,689 and for miscellaneous articles \$17,427, total per capita cost of things consumed \$103,853 per year.

At the above rate an addition of one thousand to our population would mean the expenditure of \$103,853 at wholesale prices for necessities.
