RAILROAD LITERATURE IN SCHOOLS

"Railroad publications are being extensively used in school work throughout the country and the use of such matter will increase." Mr. C. J. Gray, traveling agent of the Chicago & Northwestern Ry. is in the city today and in discussing railroad advertising with the OBSERVER, the representative called attention to the use of booklets issued by his company to teachers of geography as supplements to the regular text books. For instance the Northwestern Company has upwards of 9000 miles of line, running through seven states, and it has published pamphlets descriptive of the different localities. "In Picturesque Wisconsin," "Across Iowa and Illinois," "Through the Black Hills," "In the Copper Range." Booklets have also been issued dealing with the country reached by way of the Northwestern "Colorado," "California," "The Pacific Northwest." These publications contain descriptive matter relating to scenic and industrial characteristics of the several localities and are gotten out in very attractive form.

Another fine publication by this company is the United States wall map, which is sent to anyone requesting it and mailing postage.
