Are you buying your milk cleap or are you getting chesp milk. That is the question which every con-sumer should consider before buying. In reare five or parties contained in milk, viz. as it, ir bone material, caseins or ourd. Lutter-fat sugar, and water in proport of 5 of 1% as 1 5.5% caseins. 4% bu terfat, by tugar 87% water.
