POLITICAL ADVERTISING

The Oregon Press Association wisely decided that its members should charge for all political advertising, which is just. For years the press of Oregon has given gratis all political advertising. But now the press has unanimously decided that this advertising must be paid for, just as other reading or display advertising is paid for.

The decision of the association is sound and the politician finds himself able to pay for space if he wants to foot the bill, and the printer accepts the money for the good honest work he performs.

It will be noticeable hereafter in Oregon that the candidate that uses printer's ink judiciously and freely will get the business, just as the live, wide-awake merchant does who knows the value of advertising.

In this way too, says the Eugene Guard, the candidate can talk directly to the voter at less expense than under the old method, and the public will have a better opportunity to judge a man by his articles than under the old stump campaign method of the past.—The Dalles Chronicle.

AN OBJECT LESSON

The national government is building what is termed an object lesson road in Nebraska. It is a magnificent piece of work and will last indefinitely without doubt. Its great drawback as an object lesson is the great expense, which will be in excess of seven thousand dollars to the mile.

Seven thousand dollars is a big sum of money to expend on a mile of country road, but when it is remembered that when the road is built thoroughly, it will last for a thousand years, and every twenty years, by cheapening the cost of hauling produce over it, will save to adjoining land owners fully the final cost of building and keep it in good condition, the cost does not look so large.

The state of New York appropriated \$75,000,000 to build good roads in that state last year. This will build, at the rate of the cost to the United States to build good roads that will last indefinitely, that is as long as the adjoining land, in Nebraska, some 10,000 miles of permanent country roads.

REMEMBER THIS

When the voter goes into the primaries on primary election day he will be given either a Republican or Democratic ticket, depending on whether he is registered as a Republican or Democrat. If he is registered as a Republican he will be given a Republican ballot—a ballot on which are printed only the names of the men who are aspirants for the republican nomination. If he registers as a Democrat he will be handed a Democratic ballot—one with only the names of aspirants for nominations on the Democratic ticket. If he is not registered either as a Republican or Democrat he will not be permitted to vote either ticket in the primaries. However, he is not required to vote at the June election the same as he is registered, for he may then vote just as he sees fit.
