Two samples of good roads will be built in Oregon this summer under the direction of government experts. Through the efforts of Senator Fulton and Senator Hill, the good road enthusiasts, the agricultural department has agreed to send experts and machinery to Oregon to build two specimen roads, each one mile in length. It is the understanding that the roads shall be built near Salem and Pendleton, the respective counties to bear the expense of material and labor, and the government to pay its experts and furnish machinery. Similar work is to be done in other northwestern states, and it is planned to hereafter build two sample roads until each county has had at least one such highway. The object is to demonstrate to farmers how good roads can be built and maintained.

THE MOST IMPORTANT

Our citizens will do well to bear in mind that of all the officers they will be called upon to select at the election next June, the most important one is the county judge. The county judge has far more influence in shaping county policies and in the management of county business than any other officer. With a wide awake, progressive county judge, the road laws do not remain dead lettered laws, and the work done thereon will result in giving us good roads. Some counties operating under the same statutes are making much better showing than others because the judges in some counties take more interest in road making than in others.

The current county business is one of no small magnitude. The total expense of carrying on Union county, except for roads and highways, for the year 1905 was \$42,090.28. The county board of which the county judge is chairman, passes upon all bills against the county before the county treasurer can pay them. A commercial house or corporation would want to have some assurance of a person's ability and integrity before either would place a man in position as chief manager of its business, with authority to draw upon it for over forty thousand dollars a year.

In addition to being at the head of the current county business for the living, our county judges appoint administrators to settle up the estates of the dead. This is clothing one man with an enormous power, greater than is possessed by United States senators, governors or any other official. There is now four million dollars worth of taxable property in this county that sooner or later will be under the management of administrators or executors who will account to the county judge for the way they manage the estate. Too much care cannot be exercised in selecting a man to look after our children's inheritance.

LINCOLN

America's great men in the field of public service far surpass, in number and importance, those whom we have produced in any other line—in history, literature, science, or art. It was Gladstone's opinion that nowhere at any time had there been gathered together a group of statesmen to equal those who surrounded Washington—Franklin, Hamilton, Jefferson, Adams, Madison, Jay, and a number of others deserving to be ranked with these. Since then we have had others standing high—Marshall, Webster, Calhoun, Clay—but since Washington none who equals Lincoln in significance to the nation. And in humanity, in personal representativeness, in universality of feeling, Lincoln stands for the people, of all kinds and all places, more than any other of our statesmen of any period. The most humorous of our leaders, he was also most sympathetic and of the deepest charity. "I never heard him utter a complaint," said Grant, "nor cast a censure." And Lowell spoke of him as "sagacious, patient, dreading praise, not blame." Morally, in other words, in attributes of heart, his greatness was preeminent. None of our great men mean so much to our hearts as Lincoln. For none is the love of the people so intimate and warm. And in none are found so many qualities which can serve as the inspiration of all of us in daily life. "What Lincoln would have done" is the best guide the memory
