COSTA RICAN ROUTE

(Scripps News Association)
Washington, D. C. Feb. 16.—Wm. L. Merry, the American minister to San Jose, Costa Rica reports that the Costa Rican government has announced its intention of completing within the year the inter-oceanic railroad from Linton to Puntarenas. Only twenty-five miles of the road remains yet to be constructed. It is claimed that on account of the heavy grades the road will not be valuable from a commercial point of view as the Tehuantepec road, but by it Costa Rica will be able to market its coffee to a better advantage. This road will make for tourists one of the most delightful trips across the Isthmus. Travelers will prefer the Costa Rica route to the shorter Panama route because it is considered more healthful.
