THE TRUTH OF THE MATTER

Of the 105 counties in Kansas, 85 are without a pauper, 25 have no poor houses and 37 have not a criminal case on the docket. In Kansas, women have had full municipal suffrage since 1887.

If during these eighteen years women had neglected their homes for politics, as the opponents of equal rights prophesy that they will, half the men in Kansas would have been brought to the poorhouse by lack of thrift and domestic industry on the part of their wives, and the rising generation would have gone astray and filled the prisons to overflowing for want of motherly care. Just the opposite has happened. This is another illustration of the fact that "it is idle to argue from prophecy when we can argue from history."

When a bill was introduced a year or two ago to take municipal suffrage away from the women of Kansas, no wonder it was voted down almost unanimously, and "amid a ripple of amusement."
