PINEAPPLE ASSISTS DIGESTION

Pineapple juice bids fair to take the place of pepsin as an encourager of digestion. Recent investigations have shown that for such a purpose it is wonderfully efficacious, rivaling if it does not excel the product of poor piggy.

If a piece of ordinary beefsteak be placed in a bowl of pineapple juice, it is found, after a few hours, to be reduced to a lump of mere jelly, having undergone a process of digestion. In the same way the juice, when drank, acts upon the food in the stomach, and is capable, it is authoritatively said, of digesting something like a thousand times its own weight of edible substances.

Now, the reason back of these facts is that the juice of the pineapple contains an "enzyme," a species of ferment, which attacks the beefsteak or other food and disorganizes it. It is such an extremely powerful ferment that, acting much in the same way as pepsin, it will, in the course of a few hours, cause the substance upon which it works to dissolve and melt away. The name "bromelin" has been given to it by science.

It is extremely easy to separate the digestive principle from the pineapple juice. All you have to do is to take some of the juice and dissolve a tablespoonful or so of common table salt in it. This will cause the digestive stuff to fall to the bottom of the receptacle, when it may be easily separated. A good sized pineapple will contain more than a pint of juice—a quantity which is amply sufficient to help in the digestion of half a dozen hearty meals.

How powerful it is may be judged from the fact that a single slice of the fruit laid upon a raw beefsteak, will, in a very short time, change the consistency of the surface to that of a jelly. But it should be realized that cooking destroys the "enzyme," and that the only way to get the benefit of the digestive ferment is to eat the pineapple in its natural state.

Woman LL. D.

D. at Trinity college, Dublin, recently, was Mrs. Margaret Byers, the head of Victoria college, Belfast, who recently celebrated her jubilee of 50 years of an active professional life. In addition to her work as the cause of higher education for women Mrs. Byers has founded in Victoria homes for the reclamation and training of neglected and destitute girls.
