THE HUTCHINSON FRANCHISE

The committee from the City Council to whom was referred the matter of the Hutchinson railway franchise, recommended that such franchise be not granted until the railroad people do the following things:

1. Plank all street crossings in a good and substantial manner, as required and ordered by the Council.
2. Remove the buildings erected in Arch street, as required by the Council.
3. Cease using Arch street for terminal grounds.
4. Provide a comfortable passenger depot and waiting room for the accommodation of the traveling public.
5. Provide a new coach and modern equipment for carrying passengers.
6. Provide all cars with automatic couplings and air-brakes, as required by law.
7. Apply the motive power in front, and not in the rear, of moving trains.
8. Provide a passenger service between the city and the O. R. & N. station separate from the freight service.
9. Keep the street along the railroad free from the old ties and others obstructions.
10. Coal all engines before the train leaves for the depot.
11. Make close connection with all trains at the O. R. & N. depot.—Union Republican.
