A majority of the 200 persons that arrived at Spokane on the 22d, inst The arrivals were mostly prospective settlers. The reports are that every train out of St. Paul and Chicago for this coast has from 20 to 45 passengers traveling at colonist rates, quite a number are stopping off in Oregon.

The Rev. A. H. Sheldon, pastor of the Methodist church at Davenport, Washington, reached Spokane from a visit to northern Michigan with a party of prospective settlers, and if satisfactory arrangements can be made they say they

will bring from 50 to 50 families into Washington state
