CONFEDERATE UNITED STATES SENATORS

According to the biographies given by the official congressional directory, of the fifty-ninth congress. Second edition 1906, received yesterday by the Observer there are now thirteen members of the United States Senate who served in the Confederate army during the civil war. It is superfluous to add that all of these ex-Confederate United States Senators are now Democrats.

TIDE FLOWING WEST

To illustrate the flow of population from the other states to the Pacific coast states a few items will be taken from the Spokesman-Review of Jan. 23d.

"Piles of trunks, valises and bundles of miscellaneous baggage in the rooms and on the platforms at the Northern Pacific, the Great Northern and Oregon Railroad & Navigation companies' depots and scores of alert, ambitious men, bright eyed women and care free children tell the story of yesterday's influx in the colonist movement from the eastern and middle western states to the Pacific northwest."

A majority of the 200 persons that arrived at Spokane on the 22d, last were from Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Iowa, Minnesota and Wisconsin. The arrivals were mostly prospective settlers. The reports are that every train out of St. Paul and Chicago for this coast has from 20 to 45 passengers traveling at colonist rates, quite a number are stopping off in Oregon.

The Rev. A. H. Sheldon, pastor of the Methodist church at Davenport, Washington, reached Spokane from a visit to northern Michigan with a party of prospective settlers, and if satisfactory arrangements can be made they say they

will bring from 50 to 50 families into Washington state.

"Between 400 and 500 colonists," says the Spokesman Review, "are expected to reach Spokane today and tomorrow over the Hill lines railroads. A reporter who talked with a score of arrivals at the Northern Pacific and Great Northern depots on the 22d, said with one exception they said they were attracted to this part of the country by advertisements and printed matter."

If our people wish to take the tide of immigration and endeavor to secure a share for Union county they will have to be up and doing as the colonist rates will cease on April 7th.

The Spokesman Review says, "Reports were received at the Northern Pacific and Great Northern offices yesterday that the movement of colonists out of St. Paul is very large and, it is added, there is every reason to believe it will continue without interruption till the close of the period, April 7."

The people of Union county should bear in mind that "opportunities once passed never return."
