### IS A REGULAR WHITE ELEPHANT

San Francisco, March 6.—The Wyoming, which is at Mare Island Navy yard, and which is having the turrets altered,

is one of the vessels which it is proposed to keep indefinitely on the waiting list. The navy department has just approved a surplus of the ship to the extent of \$50,000, of which amount \$41,000 will be spent on the turrets. The remainder is intended for expenditure in general overhauling, but this amount will not be expended if it is finally decided that the Wyoming shall not go into commission at once.

### COMMISSIONERS AT CHICAGO

Chicago, Mar. 6.—Prince Tsai Tao, cousin of the present emperor of China, Commissioners Sang Chi Hong, Li Chen-to, Colonel Ghien Sheh Lin, a retinue of secretaries, interpreters and servants arrived today to take in the University of Chicago and the stock yards. They deny the rumor of the death of the empress of China, and declare that there is no rupture in the party. They said that they had learned much, but expected to learn more, such things that would make China the greatest commercial nation. They think that other nations cannot teach China the science of government.

### TWO MILLION DOLLAR LOSS

Washington, D. C. March 6.—The state department was today officially notified by the American Consul at Papeete, Tahiti that the recent cyclone had destroyed the Consulate, but that the records had been saved. The loss to the islands is estimated at two million dollars.
