COALING AT SEA IS POSSIBLE

(Scripps News Association)
Washington, D. C. March 6.—One of the most important steps taken in the navy department in the way of adding to the mobility of the fleet in time of action is the equipment of one of the naval colliers with an English apparatus which will permit coaling at sea. This has been a subject discussed with much interest by the naval general board. It is considered of equal importance with the means of repairing ships on the firing line by the employment of a floating dock. If vessels can be coaled at sea, of course, there will be a great saving in time, which, in event of war means the preservation of the integrity, and therefore the maintenance of the efficiency of the fleet. The adoption of the British system of coaling ships at sea will not be received in all quarters with approval, since it means the rejection of an American model, which was recently tested in the service and without those results deemed satisfactory by the expert observers. In the contract made for the installation of the apparatus on the naval collier it is stipulated that the contractors shall receive no compensation until the device has been fully tested under practical conditions. This will include coaling at a distance from the shore and in reasonably rough weather.

AGRICULTURAL COLLEGE JUBILEE

Hyattsville, Md., March 6.—To commemorate the fiftieth anniversary of the incorporation of the Maryland Agricultural College, exercises will be held at the college this afternoon. Many of the Alumni and former officers and professors of the institution are already here to attend the celebration. It is expected that the trustees will authorize the publication of a volume setting forth the history of the college, the steps taken toward its incorporation and biographical sketches of its executives. The Maryland Agricultural College was the first institution of its kind incorporated in the United States. It is conducted under the direction of the Maryland Board of Agriculture and P. W. Silvester is its present president.

OPENING OF IVEN'S MURDER TRIAL

Chicago, Ill., March 6.—The trial of Richard C. Iven, the slayer of Mrs. Bessie Hollister, was begun today before Judge Ben M. Smith of the criminal court. Attorney I. W. Foltz, a friend of the Ivens family is acting as defendant's counsel, while Attorney Moritz Rosenthal, a personal friend of the Hollister family, is assisting the State. It is expected that the trial will last several weeks. A great deal of testimony will be introduced by both sides.

Marysville, O., Mar. 6.—Some interesting facts have become known in regard to the wedding in Penfield, in this county, of Captain Samuel Kuhns and Mrs. Sarah Crawford, both over one hundred years old, who were sweethearts fifty years ago. Captain Kuhns first met the lady of his heart when he was a young man, studying law in Springfield, Ill. There he met Miss Jackson, a daughter of Andrew Jackson and relatives of Abraham Lincoln. They fell in love with each other, but Kuhns had not enough income to support a wife. The Mexican war came and Kuhns enlisted as a private. He returned with a captain's commission after the war.

Circumstances still prevented his marriage and besides that there was an estrangement between him and his sweetheart. When the Civil war broke out, Captain Kuhns went to the front, fought in the terrific assaults on Fredericksburg, was at the taking of Vicksburg and with Sherman on the march to the sea. He was twice imprisoned in Libby. Released from prison, without occupation or career he heard that his sweetheart was married. Stricken to the heart, he wandered for many years, and finally settled in Columbus. He never married, but cherished in silence the memory of his only love. Not long ago, at a reunion of army veterans, Mrs. Sarah Crawford, a widow—the Miss Jackson of fifty years ago—and Captain Kuhns were formally introduced. As her eyes fell upon his face she gave a hysterical cry and fell into his arms. The wedding was quickly arranged and the ceremony performed a few days later.

One of the aims of the organization is to be to make the statute authorizing the appointment of a bureau of immigration, operative. The Ozark district is particularly adapted to the raising of fruit, dairy farming, chicken raising, etc., and although these industries have already attained a high degree of development in the district, it is believed that a great deal more could be accomplished by thorough organization.

A. O. U. W. IN TROUBLE

Syracuse, N. Y., March 6.—In compliance with a call sent out by Grand Master Workman August Steinbicker the New York State Grand Lodge of the Ancient Order of United Workmen will meet here this afternoon to consider the question of preparing an appeal to the Supreme Lodge for relief.
