A ROAD DAY THE NAVAL SERVICE FOR SALEM CRIPPLED

Washington, March 7.—Judge John H. Scott, of the Oregon Good Roads Association and Judge of Marion county, has invited Senator Fulton to attend the great gathering which will mark the government experimental work in good road building near Salem some time in May. Judge Scott says that he and his fellow workers are arranging to run excursion trains to Salem during the period of the demonstration, and intend to make of it a gala day, when as many of the people of the state as can, will be instructed in road building.

Senator Fulton has expressed his purpose of attending the meeting if congress adjourns in time, but is unable to say definitely now in this respect. Many senators and the leaders of the House believe an adjournment will be had even earlier than forecasted a few weeks ago and hope that the session will close about May 1. There is a growing spirit to shorten the session, if the pending matters can be disposed of early, and the House has rushed business so as to be able to terminate the session any time it appeared that the Senate could finish.

SERIOUS FOR INDEPENDENTS

Topska, Kan., Mar. 7.—The action of the railroads entering this state, in deciding to discontinue transporting crude and refined oil at the rates named in the maximum freight rate law enacted by the state Legislature a year ago, has caused consternation among the independent refiners in this state. The railroads declare that the rates named in the law are discriminatory and confiscatory, and that they would lose money should they transport oil at those figures.

The maximum freight rate law was one of four enacted by the Kansas legislature during the height of the anti-Standard Oil Company crusade a year ago and has been the most serviceable of the four. It cut the freight rates on oil squarely in two and enabled the independent producers to find a market for their low grade or fuel oil. It also enabled the independent refiners to market their product on a parity with the Standard Oil Company in Kansas. Both the state refinery law and the act making oil pipe lines common carriers have already been declared unconstitutional. The independent producers and refiners will now make a determined effort to obtain from the supreme court a decision confirming the validity of the rate law. Feeling among independent producers here is strong, and there is a prevalent belief that the Oil Trust influence is behind the action of the railroads.

Washington, D. C., March 7.—The Navy Department has begun to hear from the commandants of the navy yards, who have just received the instructions from Washington to reduce all expenses in the way of maintenance and to discharge many of the employees to bring the cost of operation and protection of property within the limited amount required by the refusal of congress to provide the urgent deficiency appropriation for the remainder of the fiscal year.

Rear Admiral Goghlan, commandant of the Brooklyn Navy Yard, says: "The effect of the reduction of funds seriously cripples the service; the balance is insufficient to carry on maintenance work in an efficient manner."

Similar conditions are reported from other yards and stations everywhere. From Pensacola it is stated that the money at the disposal of the yard will not suffice for the operation of the electric plant alone for six months to say nothing of doing other work developing upon those in charge of protecting public property. In addition it is reported, that the station is left without the means of protection against an outbreak of yellow fever in the spring and summer, and this is a feature more than merely local effect. There is no way out of the difficulty. Congress has made no provision for meeting the deficiency, and there is nothing to do but cut down the expenses and make the available funds go as far as they may. Whatever cost may result from this form of economy will have to be borne later.
