(Observer Special) London, March 14—There was offered for sale at Christie's today what experts affirm is the original of the memori ssued by Nelson from the "Victory of Gadiz the 10th of October, 1805," The nemorandum is on the method of en gaging the French fleet. Various copie of the doctment exist, of course, but i was not until recently that the pub earned of the existence of the original draft, in Nelson's autograph. For years it has been in the possession of a family living not far from Merton Abbay. It is expected to bring a fabulous price. Nine years ago, when the autograph of Nelson's memoir of his birth, life and services, came under the hammer at Sotheby's a dealer bought it for \$5,000, and sold it to an American shortly afterward for a much higher price.
