Union county emerges from the recent severe and unusual cold snap with no injury to crops, in fact the heavy snow has been a great advantage.

Attorney General Moody was certainly hewing to the line of common sense in his arguments against the plea of immunity in the packers' case when he said "If the packers have committed no crime, they have nothing to fear."

According to the report of Stock Inspector Robert Odell, of Malheur county, there has been shipped from that county during the past year 16,993 head of cattle, 5,355 head of horses and 247,580 of sheep, nearly all of which have been shipped from Ontario, besides a large number from Harney county, which have been shipped from that point.

The high standard of the men who are now aspiring for the popular vote for United States Senator leaves no room for the legislature to find any excuse whatever in ratifying the will of the people. The member who sets himself up as a dictator in this regard will write his own political obituary the very moment that he attempts to deprive the people of the freedom from legislative farces, that have dominated Oregon in the past.

Some who have been taking an interest in the present political condition are of the opinion that the heavy tax payers of the county are not taking this personal interest in the primary law that they should. They are the ones who have to foot the bills in case mistakes are made. It may be however, that they are giving this question much more thought; that these supposed observers are aware of it. It is quite awhile yet until April 20th, that is the date when the result of the thinking will be made known.

A prominent citizen of the county stated that in his opinion the Sandridge will in time become the fruit growing portion of the county. There are several large commercial orchards started in this territory and more acreage will be planted this spring. The time was when it was thought that the Cove had a monopoly on all of the fruit land in the valley; a little later Fruitdale and May Park demonstrated that they could produce fruit and now the Sandridge is being set out in orchards and the fact will soon be demonstrated that fruit will grow in Union county wherever planted.

The city of La Grande during the past year received in moneys from all sources \$50,000. With such a revenue it hardly seems business to issue bonds to take up our present outstanding warrants, which are about \$25,000. The idea advanced in the Mayor's message for so doing was to save the discount which the city is now receiving. Warrants for the past few years have found a ready market at 95 cents on the dollar and it would only require a little careful husbandry of the city finances to bring our warrants to par. There is plenty of money in the country seeking six per cent investment. We are about to the point of spending several thousand dollars in an improved water and sewerage system. This will require the floating of a large amount of bonds and a city, like individuals, should guard its credit.

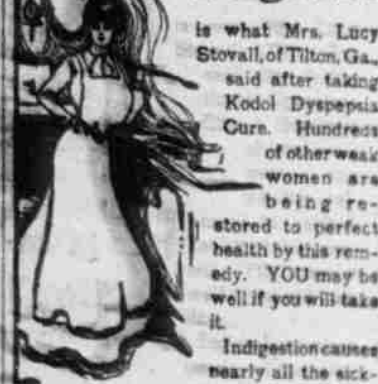
