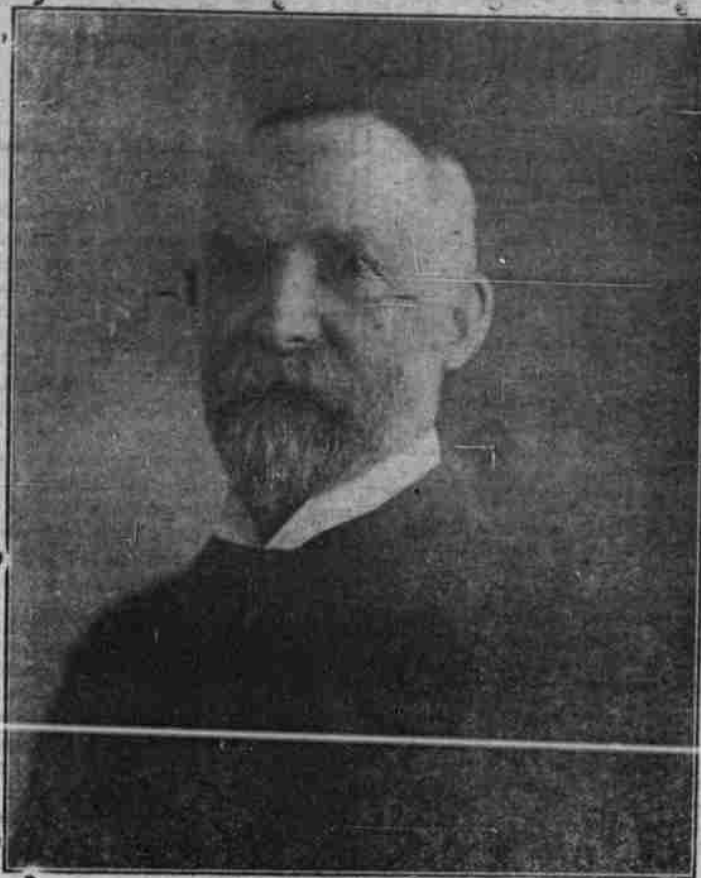

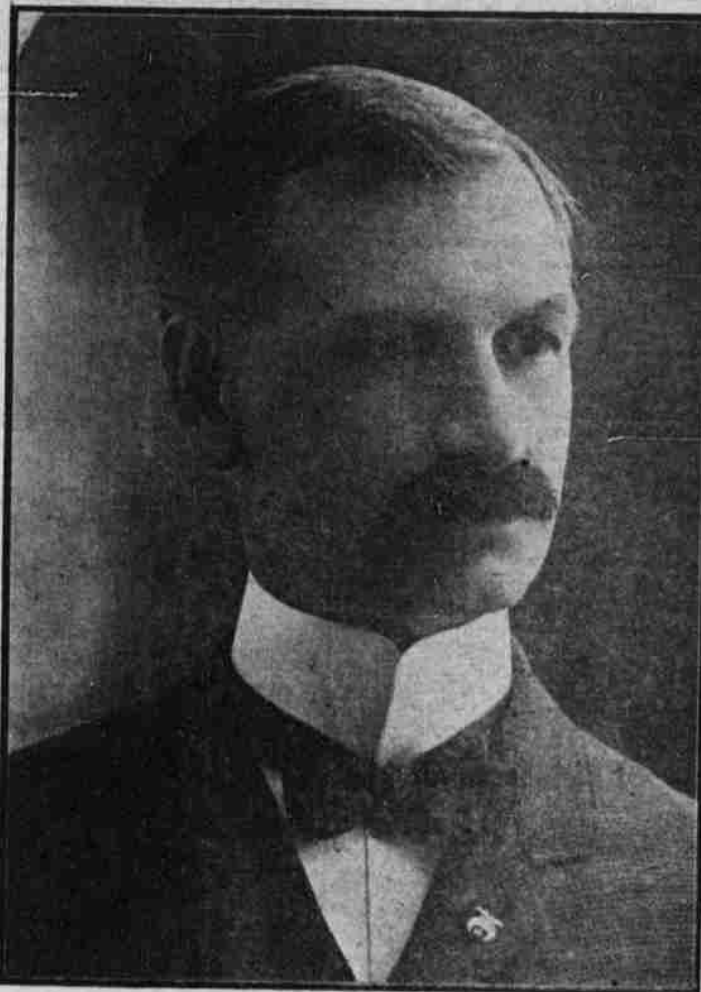

CHARLES A. JOHNS

The following editorial written by Bush Livermore, who was then editor, appeared in the Baker City Herald of the date of January 24th, 1902 lionizing Charles A. Johns who was then mentioned as a candidate for Governor:

"He might have looked for forty years and found no better man. He might have boiled all the other gubernatorial candidates in a crucible, set them to simmer and taken off the scum; and the residuum would not have approached Charley Johns in point of executive ability, adherence to principles, cleanness of purpose and personal popularity in the community where he is best known.

"Mr Johns would make an A1 governor. If he secures the nomination he would pull such a vote in these bunchgrass regions and in many sections of the

Willamette Valley as would simply overwhelm his opponent. He is a good clean man, an able lawyer, a polished gentleman, a brilliant orator, a true friend and lenient enemy. He is a typical eastern Oregonian, in nature suggesting the sturdiness of the pine, the broadness of the prairie, and the tenderness and purity of the snow which robes these heaven-climbing eastern Oregon hills in clinging garments of white.

"It would be an honor to any man to vote for C. A. Johns for Governor, and if the Hon. Charles is in earnest in his candidacy and really desires to go before the republican state convention and measure steel with other aspirants for Geer's job, the matter should receive the earnest attention of every primary voter in every Eastern Oregon precinct."

MILLIONS OF SALMON

Vancouver, B. C., March 25—Twenty-nine million sockeye salmon fry will be turned out of the dominion government hatchery at Harrison lake next week and started toward the sea. The fish are about three inches long. The operations at the Harrison lake hatchery last fall and winter were attended with great success.

The fish at the Seton lake hatchery, which is a provincial institution, will also shortly be released. Altogether this hatchery produced approximately 45,000,000 last season, and all but 10,000,000 were reared in a nursery.
