There are many good things in store for La Grande this year.

Nature and human energy will both contribute to the general prosperity of the Grande Ronde valley this year.

The corporations are being brought around to the realization of the fact that their acts are subject to investigation by the general government at any time.

The hotel men all over the state are decidedly in favor of the new primary law. There are more candidates touring the state at present than commercial men.

The sugar company will have at least 4000 acres in beets this year, the largest in the history of beet growing in this valley. This means from 35,000 to 40,000 tons of beets.

There is no mistaking the fact that public sentiment all over the Northwest is much more intent upon the enforcement of law than ever before. The "Wild and Wooly West" is a thing of the past.

By examining into the platforms it will be found that most all of the candidates take pleasure in designating themselves as "Roosevelt Republicans". Teddy's "square deal" has been received with enthusiasm in all parts of this country.

Vacant houses are quite scarce for this time of the year, as the season of activity is almost here the few dwellings now vacant will be occupied. There should be at least twenty new cottages built this spring to rent, this number will be in demand before fall.

The erection of the new O. R. & N. shops, work upon which will commence within the next three weeks, will add much to the amount of money in circulation in this city this summer. The present pay roll from the O. R. & N. Co. foots up to something over twenty thousand dollars but this amount will be doubled during the summer months. La Grande has a prosperous summer coming.

There are twelve farmers whose lands almost join each other on the Sandridge, whose total acreage is 9,000. With irrigation and allowing each farmer 80 acres, one hundred and twelve families could be comfortably housed on the same area that now contains twelve. This gives some idea as to how population will increase in this valley.

La Grande has long been in need of a hospital. At this time there is every reason to suppose that at last one will be erected here. The subscription paper which has circulated the past few days has been received in the proper spirit and already quite an amount has been subscribed. No one questions the necessity for the hospital, and so far none have refused to donate something toward securing the same. Let the good work go on.
