HENRY HENSON INQUIRES

Hon. Walter Pierce, Pres. Grande Ronde
Electric Company:

As a taxpayer, and consumer of water
in La Grande, I was much interested in
your address to the city council at its
special session last evening, but confess
that some of your statements were not
clear to my mind in regard to your Mor-
gan Lake proposition. You stated that
your purpose as submitted is to provide
the people of La Grande with a good,
abundant and wholesome supply of water,
and that the waters of Morgan Lake can
be made so merely by filtration, before
delivery to the consumers.

The question arises—Can you purify
300,000 gallons of that water every day
in the year, if needed, simply by passing
it through the same filter? And if so—
how often would you have to clean your
filtering process? While it is admitted
that it is possible to clarify water, but

can you purify that volume of water daily
and remove all deleterious matter from
it? Suppose the water contains malaria
germs, will mere filtering destroy the
same? Especially can such filtering be
accomplished by a mere mechanical ap-
paratus? Will it not require a chemical
process to eradicate the disease germs
from the water? Will it not require por-
ous stone, sand, charcoal to filter in any
effectual manner? Will not the presence
of solid matter soon clog or obstruct per-
colation in such a manner as to force the
water through necessary openings with
such rapidity that it will not be any pur-
er than when it leaves the lake? Has not
this water been declared polluted and un-
fit for domestic use by competent chemists?

You state that the interests of your
company are identical with those of the
city; not sentimental—but a straight busi-
ness proposition—to be considered that
way by both parties. Your corporation
exact a deal with the city to take a cer-
tain quantity at a certain price—to be
closed at once—but what does your cor-
poration bind itself on its part? If the
city shall contract with you as you
exact—will you enter into a bonded guar-
anty that the water you shall supply shall
be pure, wholesome, fit for domestic uses
in all respects—and perfectly free of all
deleterious matter or germs? Remember
the health of the community is at stake
in this proposition, as well as utility.
