# JAPANESE ORATOR HAS FIRST PLACE

Ann Arbor, Mich., April 4—For the first time in history the University of Michigan will be represented by a student of an Eastern race in the contest of the Northern Oratorical League, which will be held this year at Oberlin, O., on the evening of May 4. The young man who will have the honor of representing the University of Michigan in that inter-collegiate contest against representatives of six other universities and colleges is Kiyu Sue Innuu, of Kobe, Japan, a member of the senior class in the literary department.

Ever since he entered the university four years ago Mr. Innuu has taken a prominent part in oratorical contests, always winning high rank and honors. Last year in the University oratorical contest he won second place with an oration on "The Sick Man of Asia and His Doctors." This year he won first place with an oration on "The Mission of New Japan." Every summer he arranges a lecture tour through Michigan and adjoining states. His favorite topics are the various phases of the Eastern question. He is a member of the Alpha Nu Society and the founder and first president of the Cosmopolitan Club.
