within the city and see that all houses are properly numbered to comply with the regulation of the post office department so that there will be no delay in having the free mail delivery system established by the government.

6th. That the Ways and Means committee is hereby instructed to have ordinances prepared amending ordinance No. 8, series 1890, to provide for an increase of saloon license from \$400 to \$600 per annum, and to prepare an ordinance to license, tax and regulate all callings, trades and employments that the public good may require, and that are not already taxed, or that are not prohibited by law, and furthermore that the said committee report as to the general city tax and the special poll tax against property as provided in the charter.

7th. That the Mayor is hereby requested to exercise the power and authority vested in him by the charter, ordinances and standing rules and resolutions, and enforce the rules during the sessions of the council, and that he exercise a careful supervision over the city's general affairs and its subordinate officers as provided in the charter, and that he must see that, in the conduct of the city's business that the charter, ordinances, rules and regulations pertaining to the duties of officers and committees are strictly complied with.

8th. That the City Attorney be required to draw all ordinances, contracts and legal documents of whatsoever nature that the committees or council may require, in the regular course of business, and for such services no extra compensation to be allowed other than regular salary.

9th. That the Recorder is hereby ordered to prepare a complete poll tax list of the names of all persons liable for the payment of poll tax in the city, according to law, and that for the purpose of making said list he may have access to any old list used by former collectors, to the list of voters at the city election just past, to the county list that has just been compiled and to the city directory. The recorder is also instructed to comply with the rules and laws that have been enacted defining the duties of his office, and that in the preparation and presentation to the council of the reports of the various officers of the city he must see that said reports are written on the type writer or in a plain legible hand, and in proper form for filing with the city's documents. In course of time the city to furnish printed forms of a regulation size and design.

10th. That it is required of all the subordinate officers that they each perform their duties as they have been prescribed under the laws and ordinances and the rules and regulations, and that they at all times be diligent and efficient, and in their dealings with the public be polite, obliging and courteous.

11th. That the street superintendent shall collect all poll taxes as shown in the list to be prepared by the city recorder, and from all persons liable for this tax whether citizens or aliens, of whatsoever color or nationality.
