CONSTRUCTION HAS BEGUN ON CENTRAL RAILWAY

THE SCOUT MAN VISITS THE CAMP AND FINDS ACTIVE OPERATIONS IN PROGRESS

On Thursday of this week a reporter for the Scout visited the point where grading is in progress for the Central Railway. A week ago work began at the southwest corner of the S. E. Miller farm and by tonight the grade will be completed to the north side of the Conley ranch or about one fourth of the distance that will be required to grade the road-bed from the town of Union to the Cove. This is no temporary job of work as the workmen are putting the grade in shape for the ties and iron which will follow within a short time. The forces are only fairly organized and yet a little over two miles were graded the first six days. Mr. Flynn is having done is as good as that of the O. R. & N. or any other railroad. Mr. Flynn is a man who can speak with authority on such matters owing to his thorough knowledge of them. There are rumors that the new road is only a branch of the Northern Pacific, but no solid foundation can be found for them. When questioned concerning them Mr. Davidson was positively non-committal and the Scout, as well as its readers, must still remain in doubt as to who is really behind the road and what places it will connect with and what ones leave out. One thing is an absolute certainty; work is in actual progress and we have no doubt will be hurried through to completion. Possibly the Scout has not at all times seemed as friendly as it should have to the project and has said some things that might well have been left unsaid. There were many times during the past few months that the evident needless delay in starting the work caused us to lose faith in the whole project. Now, however, having investigated the matter as fully as is within our power to and being fully convinced that the road will be built, whatever its final effect, we shall aid, encourage and further its interests in every possible way.—Scout.
