REPORT OF GAME WARDEN

Salem, April 15—Game Warden, John W. Baker has prepared a summary of the results of the operation of the game laws from January 1, last, to the first of April.

Convictions were as follows: For trapping beavers, two convictions, fine \$35; for killing deer, seven convictions, fines \$625; for having in possession untagged deer hides, one conviction, fine \$25; for hunting without a license, two convictions, fine \$50; for selling deer hides, one conviction, fine \$35; for putting sawdust in streams, three convictions, fines \$125; selling fish without license, six convictions, fines \$225; killing seagulls, one conviction, fine \$5. Eight cases were dismissed and sentence was suspended in one case. The fines total \$1120.
