New York, April 14-The survey for the canal to connect the Black Sea with the Baltic Sea, has been completed, and plans for the formation of a syndicate to finance the enterprise will soon be under way. Eugene Bournonville, an engineer a id promoter of this city, will sail for Europe this month to consult with the cessionaire. The canal is to be known as the

Emperor Nicholas II Canal, and will be 1,600 kilometers, or about 1,000 miles long, 65 metres wids and 35 metres deep. It is estimated that it will require ton years to complete it, and the cost will be about \$100,000,000.
