New York, April 16—The annual Jefferson Day banquet of the Democratic Club which will be given at the Waldorf-Astoria this evening, promises to be an unusually interesting affair. President Woodrow Wilson, of Princeton University will discuss the subject of Democracy from the academic standpoint, while Judson Harmon, of Cincinnati, who was attorney-general under President Cleveland, will discuss national politics from a Democratic standpoint. The anti-Tammany Democracy will be represented by Mayor McClellan, who will deliver an address on political lines. Although nothing positive is known, it is believed that he will make some pointed reference to the political situation in New York City. The mayor will be followed by W. Bourke Cockran, the silver-tongued orator, who will bravely represent Tammany Hall, and will answer in case Mayor McClellan should make an attack on the Tiger. The number of guests has been limited to five hundred.
