San Francisco, April 23—Deaths ashes have cooled, men are at work building greater than ever, the ruins of the old city. It was announced this morning that capitalist lawyers will erect a twelve story steel structure on Powell street and also rebuild where the Hotel Rex stood, a ten story steel structure. The Pacific officials state that seven hundred and eighty-nine train loads of refugees were sent out between Wednesday and Sunday, carrying out a total of 225,000 persons.
