LABOR IN POLITICS
The decision to enter politics, taken by the American Federation of Labor, is one that sooner or later was bound to come. The division into two big parties is disappearing. The group system is gaining everywhere, and is the natural condition where no one overshadowing question divides mankind. A labor party would not do Congress any harm, and most of the ends for which organized labor works are just. The unions make mistakes. So does everybody else. On their whole record unions deserve the approbation of all liberal minds. They should be kept from despotism, as should every other power, but there is not apparent danger of their acquiring more influence than is wielded by certain other and less admirable combinations. The financial, mercantile, and professional classes have had the world's ear too much. The laborers have had it too little, and whatever gives them a more attentive hearing makes for good.

THE LIGHT IS DAWNING
The Daily Capital Journal of Salem contains the following in the issue of the 20th inst:

"In Oregon today is being struck a blow for the advancement of popular government, second only to the Declaration of Independence.

"The light of political freedom is dawning on the Pacific coast. It is breaking on the souls of men here in Oregon. Political emancipation begins today.

"The old log-rolling conventions, the packed primary, the stuffed ballots of the ballot-stuffing boss, counted by the tool of the boss, are things of the past.
