Woman's suffrage has proven to be a complete success in the state of Idaho. My experience in Idaho politics was considerable prior to the adoption of the amendment granting the right of suffrage to women, and I am consequently in a position to state that the right of suffrage has been of extraordinary influence in politics in Idaho. I feel that in no state in the Union are the women more fully enfranchised. The women citizens of the state take practically the same interest in politics here as do their brother citizens, and the woman vote is proportionately as large as the man vote at each election. In consequence of this activity Idaho at each election has had a large number of women candidates for office. The legislature has passed better laws, and the enforcement of the laws have been more rigid than in surrounding states.

LAW IS MISLEADING

Because the title to the liquor license amendment is said to be misleading, a suit has been filed to have the amendment set aside and not given place on the official ballot to be voted on by referendum vote in the coming state election.

The suit was filed in Salem yesterday by E. C. Brunaugh and E. C. Pitt and gives as the reason for the action that the amendment does not state in the title what the bill really proposes to do. It is claimed that the form of the amendment is thus rendered unconstitutional and it is probable that it will not be allowed to go upon the official ballot.
