TEST SHEEP TAX LAW

Attorney General Crawford is of the opinion that the law imposing a tax of twenty cents per head on all sheep brought into the state for grazing purposes is constitutional. The law will be tested in an appeal from Umatilla county. Oregon, at the request of sheepmen and the case will be heard at the May term of the supreme court.

The construction placed on the law by Attorney General Crawford is that it is a license and not a direct tax and therefore not in conflict with the state constitution. Whather this contention will hold good, of course, remains to be seen. The Dalles Chronicle.
