We have been having experiances here. From what I hear from the East the condition of Berkley has been greatly exaggerated. Aside from one or two brick walls and some chimneys there is no dammage here. The University of Cal. escaped damage save on buildings in San Francisco.

I was in the latter place yesterday and must say the devastation is appalling. The keenest imagination could not get any idea of the disaster without seeing it and then will come back here. 




