## IMPORTANT EGYPTIAN ANTIQUITIES

(Scripps News Association) London, May 3--Several highly interesting and important finds in the shape of Egyptian sculptures recently discovered. have been placed on view at the British Museum. Foremost among them is a collection of three statues of Usertosen III, who reigned about 2400 before Christ representing the king at three different periods of his life, in youth, in middle age, and as an old man with sunken cheeks. The figures which are of gray granite, measure little over five feet in height, and show the king wearing the characteristic Egyptian apron, upon which is inscribed his name in hieroglyphics.

There is also a colossal limestone figure of Amenophis I, who reigned about 1700 before Christ, representing the king as the god Osiris, wearing the red and white crown, symbolizing upper and lower Egypt. On the back of the statue is a portion of an inscription, which reads: "Amenhetep, beloved of Amen, Lord of the Thrones of the two lands, Giving Life."

### ENGLAND'S NAVY

(Scripps News Association) London, May 2--According to official reports Great Britain has at present no less than six battleships, ten armored cruisers, eighteen destroyers and fifteen sub-marine under construction. During the year 1906-7 four armored vessels, seventeen destroyers and twelve sub-marines will be commenced. The designs of the vessels have not yet been determined, and it is, therefore, to form an exact idea of the total liability that will be incurred by the Admiralty proposals. As far as can be gathered from the cost of recent corresponding types, however, the large amount \$40,000,000 will be absorbed as the aggregate cost of these vessels, and the sole provision made during 1906-7 to meet this expenditure amounts to about \$5,000,000 which is roughly one twelfth of the total cost.

### THETA SIGMA SORORITY

(Scripps News Association) Schenectady, N. Y., May 3--Schenectady High School became the rendezvous place of hundreds of more or less charming young women, who came to this city from all parts of the East to attend the convention of the Theta Sigma Sorority, which met at the High School Auditorium this morning at the invitation of the High School Chapter of the Sorority. An elaborate and exceedingly strenuous program has been prepared for this gathering, which includes a large number of social events, with one or two short business meetings sandwiched in. There will be a big reception this evening; a dance at the Mohawk Golf Club; a banquet on Friday evening and another reception on Saturday afternoon at the Ten Eyck. The largest delegations have been sent by the chapters in Albany, Binghamton Syracuse, Cobleskill and Rochester.

### NEW NATIONAL HYMN

(Scripps News Association) New York, May 3.--A new American national hymn, adapted to the words of "My Country 'Tis of Thee" by its composer, Prof. Giacomo Quintano, and sung by a chorus of children, will be the feature of a musical which Prof. Quintano will give at the Waldorf-Astoria this evening. The melody of the hymn, as composed by the Professor, is said to be worthy of the stirring words of the national anthem. This will be the first time that this composition has been publicly performed.

## ANTI SMOOT CASE

(Scripps News Association) Washington May 3--It is believed that the Senate committee on privileges and elections stands seven to six in favor of the general proposition that United States Senator Reed Smoot, of Utah, is not the proper man to be Senator. The division said to be against Smoot is Burrows, Depew, Dubois, Pettus, Baily, Overman and Frazier. Those of the committee favorable to Smoot are Foraker, Beveridge, Dillingham, Hopkins, Knox and Dolliver. Smoot's opponents are divided among themselves on the question as to whether he can be excluded or expelled. The next committee meeting will be on Friday when it is expected that there will be more than one report.

### WILL TALK HARDWOOD MATTERS

(Scripps News Association) Memphis, Tenn., May 3--Several hundred Hardwood Lumbermen from all parts of the country are in attendance at the National Hardwood Association, which opened here today. The local club of Hardwood Lumbermen has made every exertion to give the visitors a royal welcome and has prepared an interesting program for their entertainment. Many important matters will come up for consideration and discussion at this convention, among other things the question of how to induce the railroad companies to furnish a sufficient number of cars for the transportation of lumber when needed.
