TO ENCOURAGE MARKSMANSHIP

Every conceivable inducement is being held out to interest able-bodied citizens of the United States in acquiring proficiency in the handling of the rifle and "small arm" in order that, in case of an emergency, the Government will have a reserve of expert marksmen to take the field at a moment's notice, and defend the country against invasion. Not being content with providing ways and means, at an enormous expense, for the training of the citizen soldiers in accurate and effective rifle shooting, by providing for state and national competitive range contests and tempting trophies as a mark of efficiency, these same inducements and privileges are now offered to the private citizen, in no wise connected with a military or semi-military organization.

All that is necessary is to join a rifle club and begin to practice. These clubs are being formed throughout the United States and are branch organizations of the National Rifle Association of America, an organization that has been approved by the War Department and permitted to participate on equal terms with the military teams at the National contest for marksmanship honors and medals.

The National Rifle Association of America is a patriotic organization, organized in 1871 to promote and encourage rifle shooting, particularly to qualify individuals who may be called upon to

serve in time of war and to encourage competition between teams and individuals. The affiliated organizations are divided into three classes: first, state associations; second, regiments; third, battalions, batteries, squadrons, separate companies and rifle clubs and associations (military), and, fourth, civilian rifle clubs. Civil rifle clubs are in existence in about 14 states of the Union, and now Adjutant-General Finzer, who is Oregon's State Secretary for the National association, will endeavor to interest Oregon sportsmen and riflemen in the movement, with the view of organizing similar civilian clubs in this state.

The school board made a commendable move last night in providing that hereafter pupils must pass the twelfth grade before graduating. This means that we will have no graduating class next year. Owing to the fact that La Grande has no higher educational advantages beyond the public school it behoves this community to maintain the best public school possible, which means the maintenance of a twelfth grade.

It will be up to the Standard Oil Company to show how it has been conducting business. The Standard is quite a big concern but it will find out that Uncle Sam with Theodore Roosevelt at the helm is just a little bigger.
