Boston, Mass., May 5.—The celebration of the semi-centennial of the establishment of the Garrett Biblical Institute will begin here this evening with a big missionary rally. Bishop Hatzell, Bishop of Bashford, Dr. Homer C. Stuntz, Dr. William A. Lucy, Dr. Henry O. Cady and many other distinguished ministers will take part in the rally and will take part in the rally and will deliver addresses.
