A REAL TREAT FOR REGULARS

Washington, D. C., May 11.—It is seldom that a troop of cavalry of the regular army is so well treated in return for its gratuitous labors in behalf of charity as has been Troop H of the 13th Cavalry, on duty at Fort Myer, Virginia, which took part in a charity fete given at John R. McLean's country house near Washington in behalf of the San Francisco sufferers. The Washington woman who had obtained the services of the Troop was anxious to do something for them. She got the leading caterer of the town to send out an elaborate luncheon of sandwiches, ice cream and cake, with some kegs of beer, added to which she presented the troop with a silver loving cup, inscribed "Bravely they rode, and Well". Nothing has recently pleased army people more than this act in acknowledgment of the services of the troop.

ARBOR DAY IN RHODE ISLAND.

Providence, R. I., May 11.—In compliance with the proclamation issued by the Governor arbor day was observed today throughout the state. The children in the public schools, met in their respective schools where the teachers addressed them on the meaning and importance of the day. Then they were taken to the school yards, public parks and other places where they planted trees and flowers under the direction of their teachers. Thousand of trees were planted all over the state, many of them by private citizens and civic societies. This is the first time that the day was observed generally in all parts of the state and that exercises were held in all public and nearly all private schools.
