Today our foreign commerce employs about 6,000,000 tons of shipping. More than 6,000,000 tons of the best and most modern of this shipping is foreign. To duplicate the latter in American shipyards would require ten years of constant employment and involve an expenditure of fully \$600,000,000. Each year thereafter fully \$60,000,000 additional would be expended in our shipyards in keeping up the supply of shipping required by our foreign commerce. The earnings of the ships now engaged in our foreign carrying amount annually to more than \$200,000,000. This takes no account of the insurance, brokerage, banking and innumerable other businesses allied with shipping. Our foreign commerce is valued at almost \$3,000,000,000 annually and its volume in freight, no doubt, approximates closely to 40,000,000 tons. Fully 100,000 men would be employed upon our ships upon the seas and 100,000 men would be employed in our shipyards, more than are now employed, if we built the ships required for our foreign carrying. So much for the material interests, of a wholly economic character, at stake in the fight for an American deepsea shipping.
