VALUABLE TAPESTRIES DISCOVERED

Boston, Mass., May 12--Considerable of a sensation has been caused in Boston art circles by the statement that the famous tapestries of Lebrun, representing Summer, Autumn and Winter, which were stolen from the Palais Royal in Paris during the revolution, are now on exhibition in the Boston Museum of Fine Arts. It is stated that the discovery was made by Emile Bernat, a tapestry expert from Paris, who was called here to renovate and restore the three tapestries. He found two tags between the lining and the web, reading, "Palais Royal, Salon No. 5." He declared the tapestries the work of Lebrun and expressed the opinion that they were made between 1690 and 1730. According to the records of the Museum the tapestries came to Boston fifty years ago. If genuine they are the only Lebruns in America, and practically priceless.
