GUILLIAMS BROUGHT TO LA GRANDE

After a search of two years, John R. Guilliams has been arrested and is in the hands of the local police. He was arrested at Pendleton, by instructions of Chief of Police Rayburn, and held there until Constable McLachlen could arrive, and bring him to La Grande. He was arraigned in justice court this morning on a charge of securing money under false pretenses. The charge dates back two years, when the defendant gave a mortgage to Fred Jacobs on some personal property. When Mr. Jacobs tried to collect his money, he found that other people claimed the mortgaged property and was of course, out of the money loaned. About that time the defendant disappeared and has been wanted by the police since that time. Justice of the Peace Hough postponed the trial until Wednesday at 2 o'clock, when Mr. Guilliams will be given an opportunity to prove his innocence.
