May 18.—The anniversary of the opening of the first Peace Conference of the Hague Tribunal, which took place on May 18, 1899, was duly celebrated in all the public schools of this state today. The exercises consisted mainly in addresses by some of the teachers, giving a historical review of the events which led to the first Peace Conference, a brief account of the transactions of the conferences and an explanation and comments on the wide-reaching results which sprang from that session of the Hague Tribunal.

The results of the inquiry did not entirely satisfy the War department authorities, who referred the matter to General Grant with instructions to make further investigation and take such action as he believed to be necessary.

FOUND TEMPLE OF ONAIS

(Scripps News Association)

Boston, Mass. May 18.—The Rev. Dr. William Copley Winslow, a noted archaeologist of this city has received an extensive communication from Professor Flinders Petrie, the well known Egyptologist, containing some highly interesting details of his recent discoveries near Cairo, Egypt. According to the statements of Professor Petrie he has discovered the remains of the Temple of Onais at Tel-El-Yahu-diah, eighteen miles north of Cairo, and he has brought to light evidence of the presence of the Hyksos, or shepherd kings, in the Delta, thereby solving an interesting puzzle on this point. Prof. Petrie also states that he has, in all probability, identified the treasure city of Rameses built by the Israelites in bondage thousands of years before the time of Christ. The construction of the city is referred to in the first chapter of the book of Exodus.

The mounds of Tel-El-Yahu-diah were visited and described in 1856 by Linant the French engineer and explorer. Subsequently Greville Chester, Hayter Lewis, Dr. G. G. Dyer, and others examined and excavated the site. In 1887, for the Egypt Exploration Fund, Professor Naville made determined efforts to disclose the secrets of the mounds, but did not succeed.

Prof. Petrie, in his communication to Dr. Winslow, says: "Our discovery of the actual town and temple site of Onais is beyond a doubt. It is a very clear case of all the known requirements being satisfied as to date, place, conditions and buildings clearing the Hyksos cemetery and the great fort of the Hyksos. The tomb contain scarabs of the Hyksos, and we have got at this place scarabs of Khayan, Apepi II, and Skhanra who were probably all Hyksos."
