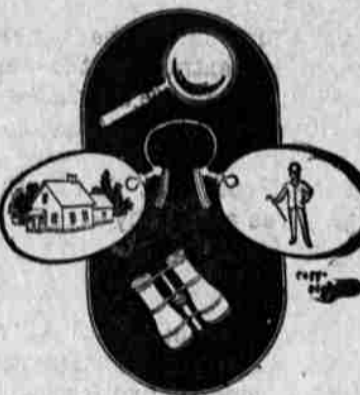

Some army officers are now questioning the wisdom of allowing foreign service representatives to attend the military service schools. Several representatives from abroad and South American countries and Mexico are now of the classes in the post graduate courses at the service schools at Fort Leavenworth and Fort Riley, Kan., but none of them have been admitted to the artillery school at Fort Monroe. It is thought that the advance of the foreign officers might lead to some naturally obvious restrictions upon the lecturers, who would have to modify their technical and tactical illustrations in deference to the presence of representatives of other governments. The reason for granting permission to foreign officers to attend the American service schools was probably prompted by commercial rather than military considerations. Officers naturally hesitate to express themselves officially against the admission of foreign officers to the American service schools lest they appear discourteous to foreign army associates, and personally the representatives who have appeared are men of attractive personality, to whom has been shown every consideration. The question is a delicate one, but it remains of some doubt whether the best facilities in the post graduate course are appreciated in a perfectly unhampered way by the existing conditions.
