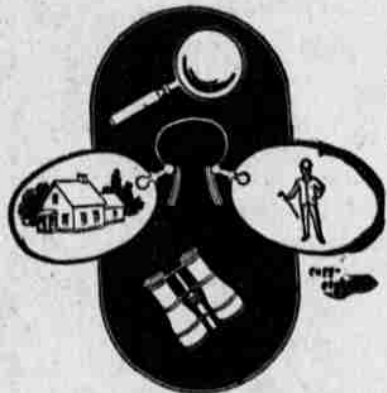

It is La Grande's move.

Union Democrats will have no trouble whatever in lining up the Union Republicans to vote for Mr. Holmes who is a Democrat. They are already lined up.

The only hope Union has of electing Mr. Holmes is that the Republicans and Democrats will split the balance of the vote so by giving Mr. Holmes their united support he might be able to step in.

If Mr. Haworth received the 1082 La Grande votes, there would be no question whatever about county division. Very well, the proper thing and only thing to do is to give them to him. There is no question but what Mr. Holmes will receive the 412 Union votes.

Just to show you how Union stand together. In the primary election Mr. Harrison received 3 votes, Mr. J. R. Oliver the balance. This mind you represents the Democratic side. Mr. T. T. Geer the Republican nominee for governor likewise received 3 votes. Union knows no politics, neither should La Grande.

The vinegar factory seems to be an assured fact, however, all of the capital stock has not been subscribed a few more days will tell the story. La Grande can not afford to lose anything that will add payrolls and give a market to our pro-

duce, a vinegar factory will create a market for the fruit we could not otherwise sell.

When it comes to the election of a representative we will soon have an opportunity to observe whether or not our Democratic friends will practice what they preach. Mr. Chamberlain, Mr. Pierce and others in this campaign maintain that there are no issues between the parties and appeal to the patriotic impulses of the voters for personal support. It certainly would be a patriotic move on the part of the La Grande Democrats to do their part in giving Mr. Haworth the 1082 votes to which he is entitled to in this city at this time. Union Republicans and Democrats will line up to a man for Mr. Holmes, who by the way is a staunch Democrat.

Results are what the OBSERVER is trying to secure. If conditions were reversed we would be working just as hard for Mr. Rothchild as we are for Mr. Haworth. The registration shows that there are 1881 Republicans in Union county to 1185 Democrats, showing a Republican plurality of 700.

If this county was strongly Democratic. If Mr. Rothchild was a member of the dominant party that controlled legislature then Mr. Rothchild would be the man to send to Salem to defeat county division, but the contrary conditions prevail.

La Grande should never let an opportunity pass to secure a payroll. Payrolls are desirable but it is only occasionally that inland cities can secure them. To illustrate, Baker City is indeed fortunate in having a large saw mill which furnishes employment to about 250 men. La Grande is fortunate in having the large railroad payroll we have and Pendleton has her large scouring mills. What all of these towns need are additional payrolls and the city that gets them will naturally grow.

There are 442 registered voters in Union. Does any one suppose for a moment that Mr. Holmes will lose a single vote, of course not he will get them all. The registration in La Grande is 1082. What is our duty? It is self answering. It is up to La Grande to decide the division question, if we do our duty the balance of the county will take care of itself.
