CONGRESS TO HONOR LONGFELLOW

Washington, D. C., May 23—Strong efforts are being made to introduce Congress as to make the necessary appropriation for the purpose of securing a site upon which a memorial monument in honor of Henry Wadsworth Longfellow is to be erected. The matter has been brought to the attention of Congress by the House Committee on Library, which recommend the appropriation of \$4,000 for the preparation of a suitable site. The monument for which the Longfellow Memorial Association has already raised a considerable sum. It is to be erected in this city and the Government will be asked to give a suitable site somewhere on the public grounds, other than the grounds of the Capitol or the Library of Congress.
