The handsome monument erected on the Odd Fellows' lot in Mount Royal Cemetery, Montreal, Quebec, was unveiled today as a tribute to the memory of the departed brothers and the beautiful spot dedicated to the purposes of Odd Fellowship. The ceremonies in connection with the unveiling and dedication were performed by the Grande Lodge officers and Mr. W. H. Hoyle, of Cannington, Ont., member for North Ontario in the Ontario Legislature, delivered the principal address. Hundreds of members of the order from other parts of the province attended the exercises.

The monument is from an original design, and is made of Barre granite, with three bases, die and cap, the All-seeing Eye and three links carved in front, with the hour glass on the top, supporting the globe, all of which are emblems of the order. The lot, which is beautifully located, was purchased two years ago by the city lodges and the monument was erected by voluntary subscription.

Another effort is being made to secure a convenient and serviceable postal note, for sending through the mails small sums of money. A bill authorizing this has been submitted to congress by the postmaster-general. Postal notes are among the things we need and the bill should by all means be given careful consideration at the present session. The postal notes would take the place of stamps and loose money in letters and would be safer because not transferable. They would be less expensive than the present money orders, no fee being charged, up to 10 cents, and probably not over 2 cents for the highest denominations, and the notes would displace money orders only for sums up to \$2.50.
