Cambridge, Mass., May 25.—The Rev. William Howe, the well known Baptist clergyman of this city, is celebrating his one hundredth birthday today. He received a large number of letters and telegrams of congratulation from friends in all parts of the country and many handsome presents arrived at the residence of the Centennarian yesterday and today.

In spite of his great age and the fact that his sight and hearing are failing, Dr. Howe possesses a mind still active and keen and every day he comes to Boston alone. Dr. Howe has lived in Boston and Cambridge for seventy years. He was the founder of Tremont Temple, and was for many years pastor of the Broadway church at Cambridge. He retired from the ministry about thirty years ago. Dr. Howe is said to be the oldest Baptist clergyman living.
