A NEW BANK BUILDING

Last evening the contract for the constructing of the new building for the La Grande National Bank was let to contractor J. L. Slater. Work is expected to commence right away as soon as the contractor can secure the material. This will necessitate the removal of the present building during which time the bank will occupy the building now being occupied by the Rainbow store. The new building will be a two story, red pressed brick, with cream terra cotta trimmings and gray stone dimensions. The building will be modern in every respect, steam heated, metal ceilings, plate glass windows and tile floors. The upstairs will be used for offices, well lighted and arranged. The total cost of the building and new bank fixtures will cost in excess of \$50,000.
