Medical responsibility for the too free and careless prescription of proprietary medicines containing these drugs, as well as opium, morphine, cocaine, etc., is given its due share of criticism; and the fact "drug fiends" are caused by patients merely continuing the same drugs that their doctors first initiated them in using is given solemn emphasis for the benefit of doctors and patients alike.

Every person who values life and health for himself and for his relatives and friends owes it as a solemn duty to read this series of articles in Collier's.

The Chicago Tribune, and various other good newspapers and periodicals, are showing the benefit of these exposures by refusing to carry patent medicine advertising. In sad contrast, however, the Cosmopolitan—which for years, under the ownership of Mr. John Brisbane Walker, refused all whisky, drug and quack medical advertising—has abandoned its old-time high purpose under the ownership of Mr. William Randolph Hearst and now fairly teems with whisky drug and quack cure "ads" of the sort that most families refuse to allow to enter their homes. But journalism as a whole is marching steadily toward the light in this regard, as both editorial and advertising columns indicate, and as soon as the religious press has been persuaded to quit advertising these health-destroyers and life-takers—as it surely must in due time—the crusade will have progressed to the point where congress will be compelled to enact legislation, not only for pure food, but against damaging drugs in protection of public health.
