IOWA MASONS MEET

Des Moines, Ia., June 5.—The sixty-third annual communication of the Grand Lodge of Iowa, A. F. and A. M. opened here today for a three days' session. The School of Instruction, as provided by the Masonic Code of Iowa, was opened here last Friday and continued through Friday, Saturday, and yesterday.

This morning the delegates formed in line on the corner of 7th and Locust streets under the direction of the Grand Marshall and marched to the Auditorium escorted by the Temple Commandary No. 4.

The public exercises at the Auditorium began at half past nine and included addresses of welcome by the Mayor and other prominent citizens and responses by the officers of the Grand Lodge. At the conclusion of the public exercises all excepting the Master Masons present retired and the session of the Grand Lodge was opened. The ceremony was performed by Grand Master Norris assisted by the other Grand officers. The Grand Master read his report and then the reports of the various Grand officers were submitted. Shortly after two o'clock the session was closed to enable the visiting members to go to Fort Des Moines and attend the battalion drill. This evening the visiting members of the Grand Lodge will be the guests of the local Masons at a theatre party in the Empire Theatre.

The Grande Lodge will hold another session tomorrow morning and afternoon and in the evening they will be given a opportunity to inspect the Capitol building, which will be thrown open for that purpose.

LIQUOR MEN WANT LOWER RATES

Louisville, Ky., June 5—The annual convention of the National Wholesale Liquor Dealers Association opened here today with a large attendance of delegates representing every part of the United States. The convention will last three days and the local men have made special efforts for the entertainment of the delegates. At the same time the National Association of Mail Order Liquor Dealers is holding its annual convention here at the Seelbach. This association which is incorporated under the laws of Kentucky has now about forty members. It was organized last year in Chicago with an original membership of seven members.

Matters of great importance to the liquor trade will be discussed at both conventions. The principal fight now on in which the Mail Order Houses are interested is a fight with the express companies for a reduced rate of transportation. The companies held for the regular merchandise rates but through the efforts of the association a reduction has been granted, the reduction however has not been great enough to satisfy the demands of the association and the fight is still being continued. Robert F. Grigler of Covington, Ky. is President of the Association.
